

## **New build RV Wim Wolff**



## Progress report #41: June 2024

The RV Wim Wolff is a new shipbuilding project for the Dutch national research fleet. The fleet is owned and operated by the National Marine Facilities (NMF), a department of the Royal Netherlands Institute for Sea Research (NIOZ). The NMF fleet consists of three vessels capable of conducting research from the shallow coastal waters out into the open ocean.

The RV Wim Wolff is intended to replace the Wadden Sea research vessel RV Navicula, and with its shallow draught of 1 meter it is specifically designed for overnight voyages for research in the Wadden Sea, the Zealand delta or the coastal zone.

With a permanent crew of four, the RV Wim Wolff will offer state-of-the-art facilities for a maximum of 12 passengers, and is equipped with onboard dry and wet lab facilities. The vessel also has room for two customised lab containers on the working deck.

The RV Wim Wolff was built by Thecla Bodewes Shipyards (TBSY) in Harlingen, and it was delivered to NIOZ there on Monday, 10 June 2024.

On Monday, 10 June, Thecla Bodewes Shipyards officially transferred ownership of the RV Wim Wolff to the Royal Netherlands Institute for Sea Research (NIOZ).

The handover ceremony was held in Kampen, in the presence of a small number of guests from the shipyard, NIOZ and the subcontractor firms.

The ceremony began with the signing of the transfer documents.

After a toast and some brief speeches, the shipyard's private signal was struck and the NIOZ signal was hoisted to signify the change of ownership.

The next day, the permanent NIOZ crew sailed the RV Wim Wolff to its home port on Texel.

On Monday, 17 June, the RV Wim Wolff started work for the NIOZ as part of the SIBES project (Synoptic Intertidal BEnthic Survey), with a full complement of 14 scientists and 4 crew on board. The project is a perfect start to the new vessel's scientific career.
